STAFF BUSINESS

Operations Report: Chief Cole reported on the following:

- We were up 192 calls from June of 2016. That is a 14% increase or an average of an extra 5 calls per day.
- The fireworks ban in the City of Marysville seems to have had positive effects. July 4th and the week leading up to was extremely quiet for the Marysville Fire District with only five fireworks related calls in the city.
- The 17-2 recruits are now completing shadow shift. All recruits working a shadow shift will be wearing a red t-shirt to easily identify them on calls.
- We have three recruits graduating from the Washington State Fire Academy on Friday, July 28, 2017, 10am at TPC Snoqualmie Ridge Golf Course. They will be back on line the second week of August. We will send our next group of five to North Bend in August.

<u>Overtime Report:</u> Chief Cole reported, as expected, our overtime numbers are up due to injuries, separations, and FMLA. This may put us over budget for the year.

Hose Replacement: DC Neuhoff reported that BC Taylor is working on the process of replacing 1/3 of our hose that failed during the 2017 Annual hose testing performed by National Hose Testing Specialty, Inc. We will be holding a vendor event to learn about the different types hose available. An invitation has been extended to neighboring districts to attend the event.

July 19, 2017


- > The total fire loss for 2017:
 - There were 15 fire incidents investigated in 2017 (through July 11), with \$6.4 million in assessed value and over \$3.2 million in fire loss.
- ➤ We did see a reduction in fireworks related incidents and I have attached the final report. The public education campaign helped and we plan on doing the same thing for next year.
- ➤ Homegrown is coming in August in downtown and we will be participating in the citywide booth.
- Christie just returned from taking her public educator class in Yakima. She was able to meet some of her Washington state peers and create partnerships. She has passed her test for public educator.
