FIREFIGHTERS QUICK RESPONSE PREVENTS SPREAD OF FIRE

Marysville, WA – Marysville Fire District firefighters prevented a vehicle fire from spreading to a nearby home in the 30th block of 79th Avenue NE on Saturday morning.

Snohomish County 911 received a report from a citizen of an RV on fire at 8:17am on June 27th. Fire crews arrived on scene in approximately five minutes to find an RV, pickup truck and small trailer on fire, with flames threatening the nearby residence.

Firefighters quickly brought the fire under control, successfully preventing the fire from extending to the home. The RV, truck and trailer were destroyed. Estimated loss is over \$40,000.

No residents or firefighters were injured. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Marysville Fire District was assisted at the scene by Snohomish Regional Fire & Rescue and Snohomish County Fire District #22. This coordinated response helped contain the fire quickly and protect nearby property. The Marysville Fire District would also like to thank Marysville Police and Snohomish County 911 for their assistance.

Have wiring, batteries, propane systems and appliances checked regularly, repair damaged cords or components promptly, and never overload electrical circuits.
